## Endowed Scholarship Descriptions

**Adams- Sam Adams Young Life Scholarship** – This scholarship was established in honor of Sam Adams, who along with Pete Bennett, and Bobbie Davis brought the Young Life program to Spokane. The scholarship will be awarded to a student who is involved in the leadership of Young Life in Spokane.

**Alumni- Alumni Association Scholarship** – Through efforts of the Whitworth University Alumni Association and generous alumni support, this scholarship has been established to foster the legacy of alumni whose children choose to attend Whitworth University.

**Anderson- Charles W. & Madeline P. Anderson Scholarship** – This scholarship was established by Clavie and Verne Lupton in honor of Mrs. Lupton’s parents to financially assist students who have maintained high academic achievement and also share a commitment to Jesus Christ.

**Baird- The Reverend Edward E. Baird Philosophy Scholarship** – This scholarship was established in 1988 by Dr. and Mrs. Forrest E. Baird in honor of Forrest’s father. This scholarship is to be awarded annually to a Philosophy major or a student preparing for mission work.

**Baird Travel- Ruth Baird Travel Scholarship** – Mrs. Ruth Elizabeth Blaine Baird loved to travel and instilled that love of travel in her children. In honor and memory of their mother, Mrs. Baird’s children have established a scholarship fund to provide \$1,000 to enable a philosophy student without significant previous travel experience to participate in a Whitworth study tour.

**Baldwin- Estella Baldwin Scholarship** – This scholarship was established by those who knew and loved Estella Baldwin, an alumnus of Whitworth, to honor her life’s work and her dedication to God’s call to service.

**Baugh- Baugh Family Scholarship** – Odin and Deede Baugh established this scholarship in gratitude for the “mind & heart” education they received from Whitworth. The scholarship is to provide assistance to a student pursuing a degree to prepare for a career in Health or Human Service (i.e. Medicine, Education, Ministry, etc.).

**Bennett- James and Karla Bennett Endowed Scholarship** – Jim Bennett graduated from Whitworth in 1989 with a Business degree. He attributes his many successes in life to, his important extracurricular experiences coupled with a great mind & heart education and professors who cared. He and Karla established this scholarship as a way for them to ensure that others will also benefit.

**Biermann- Elinore Biermann Scholarship** – Mrs. Biermann established this scholarship to help outstanding Junior or Senior Business, Economic or Accounting students who are graduates of Lewis & Clark High School of Spokane or students having a permanent residence in Spokane County.

**Blanchard- The Gordon L. Blanchard Memorial Scholarship** - This scholarship is used to recognize those exceptionally talented music students whose contributions

assist in building and maintaining a high quality music program at Whitworth University.

**Bocksch- The Bocksch/Stien/Hicks Scholarship** – This scholarship was established by alumni and friends in honor of Dr. Bocksch, Dr. Stien, and Dr. Hicks, retired Whitworth professors. This scholarship is awarded to a Biology or Chemistry major in the spring of odd-numbered years.

**Bolton- Bolton Family Scholarship for Business Students** – Harvey and Gail Bolton established this scholarship as a reflection of their commitment to Christian Higher Education.

**Boppell- Karlyn Boppell Music Scholarship** – Chuck Boppell established this scholarship in the late 1990s to honor his wife upon their wedding anniversary.

**Brass- Whitworth Endowed Brass Scholarship** - This scholarship is awarded annually to the outstanding brass player who is majoring in Music Education.

**Buckler- Marketta Whitlow Buckler Scholarship** – This scholarship was established in memory of Mark Whitlow, to be given to a student with a major in religion or music.

**Burton- Christina Lynn Burton/Elsie Lucille Jump Scholarship** – Tyson Burton, Class of 2001, established this scholarship to honor his mother, Christina Lynn Burton, and his grandmother, Elsie Lucille Jump. Tyson received his BA from Whitworth in Sports Medicine and Secondary Education.

**Caldwell- Naomi A. Caldwell Scholarship** – This scholarship was established by David Caldwell and his wife in memory of his mother, Naomi Caldwell, who despite her limited means, supported her church, and many other causes, including Whitworth.

**Carlson- Carlson Family Endowed Scholarship** – John and Marie Carlson established this endowed scholarship to support students majoring in business who are committed to integrating their Christian faith, values and ethics with a successful career in business.

**Carlson- John A. Carlson Mathematics Scholarship** – This renewable scholarship is awarded to students majoring in mathematics.

**Carrel- Anna J. Carrel Music Scholarship** – The scholarship was established from the estate of the late Mrs. Carrel who taught music at Whitworth from 1938-1968.

**Cheney- Ben B. Cheney Foundation Scholarship**- The Cheney Foundation awards scholarships to outstanding students in the senior class.

**Coca Cola- Coca Cola Future Teachers Minority Scholarship**- The goal of this scholarship is to recruit, retain and graduate more teachers from under represented ethnic groups who can go on to become teachers who serve as role models and mentors for students of all backgrounds.

**Comer- The Mary E. Comer Endowed Scholarship** – This scholarship was established by the estate of Mary E. Comer, the widow of Whitworth alum, Sylvanus M. Comer. Per the will, the scholarship is for students majoring in biology, covering ecology or environmental studies.

**Cooper- Caroline Cooper Scholarship** – Caroline Cooper specified in her will that the annual income from the Caroline Cooper Trust be used for a worthy Whitworth student preferably studying science, pre-med, or ministry.

**Crececius- L.E. and Bonnie Crececius Scholarship** – Mark Crandall established this scholarship in honor of his Uncle and Aunt, L.E. and Bonnie Crececius, who have been long time supporters of Whitworth. The scholarship is for Pre-Med students.

**Crippen- Mary Pierce Crippen & Curtiss Edmund Crippen Memorial Scholarship** – This scholarship was established by Mary B. Crippen Marshall and John I. Marshall, to glorify our Lord Jesus Christ and to honor the memory of Mary's beloved parents. This scholarship is to be used to support students accepted to the Certification for Ministry program.

**Culverwell- Ethel Klein Culverwell Memorial Scholarship**-This scholarship was established by Albert Culverwell in 1975 in memory of his wife, Ethel Klein Culverwell, a piano teacher at Whitworth.

**Cutshall- Mark Cutshall Creative Writing Award** – This scholarship was created by Mark Cutshall, a 1977 alumnus of Whitworth University, whose intent is to give back to Whitworth and make it possible for a student to receive what he received years ago. The scholarship is awarded to an English major.

**D'Urbal- John and Isabel d'Urbal Writing Award** – This scholarship was established by Isabel d'Urbal, a 1975 Whitworth grad, in memory of her husband, John d'Urbal. He was a newspaperman at the Spokesman-Review until he retired.

**David- Zeola D. David Endowed Scholarship** – Daryl David established this scholarship out of love for his mother, Zeola David. She received both her Bachelor's and Master's Degrees from Whitworth and taught school in Sandpoint, Idaho from the late 1940s into the 1960s.

**Dechance- Yvonne Dechance Music Scholarship** - This scholarship was created by Yvonne Dechance for two rising junior voice majors, or music education majors with a voice specialty. The funds are intended for purchasing music scores and books to assist them in vocal studies, and to begin building their personal libraries.

**Dellenback- John Dellenback Memorial Scholarship** – This scholarship is to honor the memory of former Congressman John R. Dellenback, who led a life of distinguished service, active in local, regional, national and international affairs. increasing educational opportunities to deserving students.

**Dixon- Harry and Marjorie Dixon Scholarship** – This scholarship was developed in appreciation of Dr. Harry Dixon who contributed over 20 years of outstanding Christian teaching and leadership at Whitworth.

**Dixon-Business- Grant and Grace Dixon Endowed Scholarship in Business** – In September of 2000, Grant (the III), Janice, and Hal Dixon, and their spouses established an endowed scholarship in business in honor of their parents, Grant (Jr.) and Grace Dixon.

**Dixon-Music- Dorothy Dixon Music Scholarship** – Because of her love for young people and music, Mrs. Dixon requested that memorials in her honor be used for a music (voice) scholarship.

**Early Fifties- Early 50s Scholarship** – A group of dedicated alumni began gathering support for this scholarship in 1992. Most of the contributions for the scholarship have come from graduates and their spouses from the 1950-54 classes.

**Erickson- Glen P. Erickson Memorial Scholarship** – The family of Dr. Glen Erickson established this scholarship in his memory after his death in a drowning accident in 1982.

**Fardal-Winget- Sheryl Fardal-Winget Memorial Scholarship**- This scholarship was established to perpetuate the memory of, Whitworth graduate and special education teacher, Sheryl Fardal-Winget.

**Fetterman- Fetterman Scholarship**- I.S. and Emily Fetterman's gifts have funded a scholarship for music.

**Flora- The Flora Writing Award**- The recipient of this award must major in the Communication Studies Department, be of junior or senior standing, and make a significant, identifiable contribution to the improvement of one of the University's communication media.

**French Study Tour- Pierrette Christianne-Lovrien France Study Tour Scholarship**- Pierrette Gustafson set up this scholarship to benefit a student who would be a part of the France Study Tour.

**Friesen- Delbert R. Friesen Memorial Scholarship**- This scholarship was established in memory of Dr. Friesen by family, friends, and colleagues. Dr. Friesen was a faculty member in the physics department and was beloved by both students and colleagues.

**Frimoth- Martha Estelle Frimoth**- This scholarship was established in the memory of Martha Estelle, born to Bud and Lenore Frimoth, who died when she was three and a half -years old. During Martha's illness, her parents were constantly reminded of the generosity and kindness of others.

**Gaffney- Kevin Gaffney Memorial Scholarship**- This scholarship, in the remembrance of Kevin Gaffney, aims to provide financial aid to students working to serve their community.

**Gage- Howard Gage Memorial Scholarship**- This scholarship is awarded in memory of Dr. Howard Gage, Professor of Mathematics and Computer Science from 1969 to 2001.

**Gammons- Sarah Lou Gammons Memorial Scholarship**- In 1973, the Rev. Kenneth P. Gammons established this scholarship in memory of his wife, Sara Lou Gammons, a former Whitworth University student.

**Goben- Sandra K. Hanson Goben Memorial Scholarship Fund**- Melvin S. Hanson attended Whitworth for a year before he transferred to University of Southern California. Although Melvin received a chemical engineering degree from USC, he continued to have a true love for Whitworth.

**Gowdy- J. Wilson Gowdy Memorial Scholarship**- The Gowdy family established this scholarship as a memorial to Mr. J. Wilson Gowdy.

**Grace- Gordon Stanley Grace Memorial Scholarship**- This scholarship was established in memory of Gordon Stanley Grace, a sophomore student, who died in a climbing accident on May 31, 1979 while on a Whitworth sponsored geology tour.

**Graham- Graham Family Scholarship**- The Graham family music scholarship was established for the purpose of providing vocal lessons to less experienced, but promising vocalists.

**Gray- Alfred O and Nicolin Gray Scholarship**- This scholarship was established in remembrance of Alfred O. and Nicolin Gray.

**Gray C.- Cameron Gray Memorial Scholarship-** The Grays established this scholarship with the hope that it would allow one or more students to stretch, grow and learn to serve the Lord in deeper and broader ways.

**Grinalds- Henry F Grinalds Northwest Christian Scholarship-** This scholarship fund was established by Mr. Henry F Grinalds, a long time resident of Spokane, Washington, as a reflection of his commitment and loyalty to the Spokane community and his belief in the importance of a quality education for the future leaders of this country.

**Haas- Garland “Gus” and Pauline Haas Endowment: Resource Fund-** The scholarship is to honor the memory of Dr. Garland “Gus” Haas who was a long-time faculty member in the Department of Political Science at Whitworth.

**Hagman- Sue Hagman Memorial Scholarship-** This scholarship was established in memory of Susan Packard- Hagman, '90. Her journey with cancer served as an inspiration and example of God’s love and grace for many through her “Petunia letters,” which chronicled gifts from God and other people during the course of her illness.

**Hamblen- Herbert M. Hamblen Leadership Scholarship-** Herbert Moore Hamblen was a life-long resident of Spokane who was active in a broad range of community affairs, which included being a member of the Whitworth Board of Trustees for 28 years, and serving three terms in the Washington House of Representatives.

**Hammack- Michael Hammack Memorial Chemistry Scholarship-** This scholarship was established by family and friends as a tribute to Michael, a Whitworth student.

**Hansen- Carl M. Hansen Scholarship-** The Carl M. Hansen Foundation funds this scholarship to students to encourage them to attend Whitworth and make it more affordable. This scholarship is intended for Pre Engineering students.

**Hardwick- Frances Tiley and Fern Hardwick Memorial Scholarship-** Frances Tiley Hardwick was born in Bristol, England and received his Bachelor of Arts from the University of London and his Ph.D. from the University of Washington. Dr. Ward Sullivan, Whitworth’s president, asked Dr. Hardwick to assume the position of Dean of Whitworth College in 1929.

**Hearst- William Randolph Hearst Foundation Scholarship-** This scholarship will be awarded to those who do not qualify for traditional financial aid because the value of their material assets is high, yet their annual income makes continuance at Whitworth University exceedingly difficult. Recipients must be Communications majors.

**Heart for Ministry- First Presbyterian Church of Spokane Heart for Ministry Scholarship-** “We are called to spread the love and word of Jesus Christ throughout the world.” In response to this purpose, First Presbyterian Church of Spokane established an annual scholarship at Whitworth to encourage young people to cultivate their minds, and hearts as Christian leaders, as they prepare to serve the world as missionaries.

**Hegg- The Hegg Family Scholarship Fund-** Two generations of the Hegg family chose Whitworth College, and they earned ten degrees from Whitworth as of 1997. The Reverend C. Theodore Hegg, '47, and his wife Edith worked with their five sons and four daughters-in-law, all Whitworth graduates, to establish this scholarship.

**Hendrick- The Eileen “Mom” Hendrick Scholarship-** Eileen Hendrick was the last of the “dorm mothers.” For 15 years, she ceaselessly gave to the University, a caring example and witness to Christ’s love.

**Hopkins- The Lou and Maudie Hopkins Endowed Scholarship-** The scholarship was established by Mr. and Mrs. Louis Hopkins, former residents of Walla Walla, Washington.

**Hopkins-Music-The Winifred McNair Hopkins Scholarship –** This scholarship was established in memory of Winifred McNair Hopkins who taught in the Department of Music at Whitworth College from 1934-47, died in September, 1984, at the age of 97.

**Icho- The Icho Scholarship-** Five former residents of Carlson Hall decided to fund The Icho Scholarship. Pete Hanke, ’83, Chris Herron ’79, Mark Weakley ’83, John Wells, ’81, and Eric Stebbins, ’84 created this fund to celebrate their lifelong friendship that began at Whitworth. The Icho group hopes that Icho Scholars will become part of a growing network after graduation to assist each other professionally and eventually add their support to the Icho Scholarship.

**James- The James Family Centennial Scholarship-** Bill, ’84, and Terrilynn James established this scholarship. Believing that the Lord had been very good to him, Mr. James wanted to return some of his blessings to the school.

**Jenkins- Marion Jenkins Memorial Scholarship-** This scholarship was established by the alumni of Whitworth University to recognize the scholastic and personal achievements of some of its students while honoring the memory of Marion Jenkins, a former Whitworth Dean of Women.

**Johnston-Hanson- The Johnston-Hanson Foundation Scholarship-** The Johnston-Hanson Science Scholarships provide key financial assistance to outstanding students at Whitworth University.

**Kison-Waitsburg- Waitsburg Presbyterian Women Scholarship in Memory of Dorothy Louise Kison-** Waitsburg United Presbyterian Church established this scholarship in memory of Dorothy Louise Kison, a pillar of the Waitsburg community.

**Koopmans Neir – The Kathie Koopmans Neir 1963-1965 Endowed Scholarship –** This scholarship was given in honor of Kathie Koopmans Neir (Class of 1964) by the graduates of the classes of 1963, ’64, and ’65 in appreciation for Kathie’s leadership and organization of the 2005 reunion, when over 200 attended the event.

**Lamon-Siems- Lamon-Siems First Generation Scholarship-** This scholarship was established by Laurie Lamon and William Siems for a deserving first generation college student at Whitworth.

**Loon- Loon Lake Congregational Church Scholarship-** In 2005 the Loon Lake Congregational Church dissolved and the leadership decided to apply a bequest, donated in memory of Colleen and Walter Denny, to further the work of Christ’s church by assisting in the training of young people prepared to minister in Christian service.

**Loveless – H. Kenneth Loveless Endowed Scholarship –** Ken Loveless wanted to show respect to those who influenced his life while attending Whitworth, by giving back some of the assets he was fortunate to accumulate over his lifetime in the form

of a scholarship. Recipients must major in chemistry, biology, physics, or other scientific areas.

**Koehler- President Mark and Clara Belle Koehler Scholarship-** This scholarship was established in conjunction with Whitworth's Centennial Campaign, celebrating the university's first 100 years of providing a high quality Christian liberal arts education for its students.

**Laurie- Jason Laurie Memorial Fund-** Jason was a fourth generation Whitworthian. His life ended too soon, as he fell ill during his freshman year at Whitworth University. This endowment was established in memory of Jason and in celebration of all that Whitworth University has meant to the Laurie family.

**Levy - The Madelyn G. Levy Scholarship-** This scholarship was established by Madelyn G. Levy to help further the education of church musicians, specifically organists and choir directors.

**Lindsey- Guy and Gertrude Lindsey Memorial Scholarship-** This scholarship was established, through a generous gift from Guy and Gertrude Lindsey, to assist students who achieve academically, are deserving, and have a high financial need.

**MacDonald- MacDonald Scholarship-** This scholarship is to encourage students majoring in Psychology to prepare for a career in Christian Higher Education and to affirm and reward significant scholarly accomplishment.

**Marshall- John I. Marshall Memorial Scholarship-** Mary B. Marshall established this scholarship in honor and memory of her beloved husband, John I. Marshall. This scholarship is to be used for students accepted to the Certification of Ministry or Music Ministry programs or Religion students with proven experience or interest in serving the Kingdom of God through mission work or church leadership.

**Martin- The Lucille G. Martin Voice Scholarship-** Leonard Martin, a retired member of the music faculty and his sons established this scholarship in 1984 in honor of Lucille G. Martin, beloved wife and mother.

**Melrose- Marie Melrose Endowed Scholarship-** Marie Melrose was the daughter and granddaughter of career Presbyterian missionaries to China. Marie also served the Presbyterian Church in Korea as a Christian educator and missionary.

**Mollendorf- The Cliff Mollendorf Scholarship -** Cliff Mollendorf grew up in the Browne's Addition section of Spokane and renovated properties in that area with his father when he was a young man. He worked as a contracting foreman during World War II and later became a building inspector. He established this scholarship to provide financial aid for students who most need it.

**Moore- Dewaine and Bertha Moore Scholarship-** This scholarship was established in 2004 by the Moore's. Dewaine and Bertha are the parents of Cynthia Joy Wright, '05, enrolled in the Whitworth University Athletic Training Program.

**Morgan- Haydn P. and Evelyn J. Morgan Scholarship-** Haydn P. Morgan served on the Whitworth Board of Trustees from 1951-1983. While he made his living as a Spokane businessman, some of his greatest joy came in his love of his music.

**Music- Music Excellence Scholarship-** This scholarship was established in memory of Dr. Hans Moldenhauer (1906-1987) as an expression of respect and appreciation for all that he meant to us and has contributed to the world of music and of scholarship.

**Myhre- Leonard “Bud” A and Loretta Myhre Scholarship-** This scholarship was established by Leonard and Loretta Myhre. Mr. Myhre was chairman of the Hallidie Machinery Company. He retired in 1982, but the company remains in the Myhre family. Mr. Myhre was a Deacon, Elder, and Trustee of University of Presbyterian Church, Seattle, Washington.

**Myung Sung – Myung Sung Presbyterian Church Scholarship –** Rev. Sam Whan Kim founded Myung Sung Presbyterian Church in 1980 and has served as the church’s senior pastor for more than two decades. The church has become one of the largest churches worldwide. The success of the church has been attributed to Kim’s leadership and ministry skills. He established the Myung Sung Presbyterian Church Scholarship at Whitworth to be used for pre-ministerial students.

**McCall- McCall Family Leadership Award-**John and Jean McCall became acquainted with Whitworth as parents of Whitworth students. The students found Whitworth to be a place where they could grow in their intellect, faith and leadership skills.

**Nalos- Richard Nalos Scholarship-** Mr. and Mrs. Ervin J. Nalos established this scholarship in honor of Richard Nalos. Ervin Nalos writes “My father, Richard Nalos, who was an emigrant from Czechoslovakia, who started a lumber business in Canada and was a faithful member of the Presbyterian Church in Vancouver.

**Neir- The Kathie Koopmans Neir 1963-1965 Endowed Scholarship –** This scholarship was established in honor of Kathie Koopmans Neir (Class of 1964) by graduates of the classes of 1963, ’64 and ’65 in appreciation for Kathie’s leadership and organization of the 2005 reunion, when over 200 attended the event.

**Novasky- Novasky Family Endowed Scholarship-** Rob and Kathie Novasky know as well as anyone the financial investment required for a Whitworth education, as students first, and then as parents of Whitworth students. In addition, they recognize that they were given many opportunities due to the financial sacrifices of others, and they want to be able to provide those same opportunities for today’s students.

**Nupen-Computer- Orville and Georgetta Nupen Scholarship-** This scholarship was established in honor of Cliff Nupen, by his wife, Georgetta, a 1950 Whitworth alumna. Cliff’s interest in computer science was evidenced by a career at IBM.

**Nupen-Nursing- Orville and Georgetta Nupen Nursing Scholarship-** Orville and Georgetta Nupen established an endowment fund with Whitworth University to support an annual scholarship in nursing.

**Olson- Jef Olson Outreach Scholarship-** Jennifer “Jef” Olson was a 1981 graduate who died in a rock climbing accident in 1982.

**Patten-Les & Georgene Patten Endowed Scholarship Fund -** Les and Georgene Patten graduated from Whitworth in 1950 and Georgene established this scholarship in 2007. Student’s majoring in math/computer science or communications will be given priority.

**Paulson- The Marthabelle Paulson Scholarship-** This scholarship was established in 1989 by Marthabelle Paulson, a long time member of the Whitworth University Auxiliary.

**Penhalurick- Harold E. Penhalurick, D.D., Scholarship-** The Harold E. Penhalurick, D.D. Scholarship was established by Darline Penhalurick and Alice Penhalurick Lindsey to honor Harold Penhalurick, a 1935 graduate of Whitworth.

**Plotkin- The Lisa Marie Plotkin Scholarship-** This scholarship will be awarded to a handicapped student or a student majoring in work to benefit the developmentally disabled.

**Polhemus- Dale Polhemus Memorial Scholarship-** This scholarship was established by Martin “Marty” and Jean Polhemus in loving memory of Marty’s brother Dale who is remembered by family as full of laughter.

**Polhemus- Jean Polhemus Scholarship-** Jean (Bruene) Polhemus was born in July 1921. She graduated from Iowa State University with a degree in home economics. In 1943, she married Martin “Marty” Polhemus who joined the Whitworth College Board of Trustees in 1967. Jean is an active member of the Whitworth Auxiliary.

**Presbyterian- Presbyterian Synod/AK Northwest-** The Synod of Alaska-Northwest Presbyterian Church established this scholarship to encourage high-potential Presbyterian students from the local Native American population to further their education and through their commitment to Christ.

**Presser- The Presser Foundation Scholarship-** This scholarship shall be awarded to an outstanding music major at the end of his or her junior year. This is intended to be a prestigious award recognizing excellence.

**Quall- Alvin B. Quall Nursing Scholarship-** An endowment fund, in the name of Alvin B Quall, has been established at the College of Nursing, formerly called Intercollegiate Center for Nursing Education to provide an annual scholarship in nursing for students enrolled through Whitworth University.

**Randall- Katharine Parker Randall Scholarship-** Born in Pekin, Illinois, Katherine Parker Randall graduated from Coe College in 1921, in a day and time when it was unusual for women to go to college. She attained her four-year teaching degree and came to Spokane in the early 1920s.

**Robertson- Florence Robertson Scholarship-** Florence Robertson was the mother of Lorraine Robertson Stuart, Associate Chaplain at Whitworth from 1976 to 1984. Florence became familiar with Whitworth through her daughter and came to have a great appreciation for the school and its special mission.

**Robinson- Bonnie V Robinson Keyboard Scholarship-** In recognition of her career and ministry as a classical pianist and concert organist, John and Judy Scotford established this scholarship to honor Bonnie Robinson in 2000.

**Rodkey- Helen and Verne Rodkey Family Scholarship-** This scholarship was established through the Estate of Helen Rodkey. Helen (Piper) and Verne Rodkey settled in Post Falls, Idaho, in 1934, where they farmed and became active members in the Community Church of Post Falls.

**Rosenquist- Werner Rosenquist Scholarship-** The Werner Rosenquist scholarship was established in December, 1989, to honor Werner Rosenquist for his dedicated and unselfish commitment as President of the Whitworth Foundation for seventeen years.

**Sanford- Dan C. and Barbara A. Sanford International Business Scholarship-** The donors of this scholarship are alumni of Whitworth who have been immensely blessed by God through the teaching and programs of the university.

**Sanford- The B. Champ and Olive M. Sanford Memorial Scholarship-** The B. Champ and Olive M. Sanford Scholarship in International Studies was established by Mrs. Olive Sanford in honor of her late husband. Champ Sanford was a well-known

Washington State architect who struggled to finance his education during the depression.

**Saunders- James E. Saunders Memorial Scholarship-** This was established in memory of James Eric Saunders, also known as Jim or “Jimbo” to family and friends. He lived a life worthy of honor and respect, not because of the Washington State Patrol uniform he wore for eight years, but because of his character and heart that were evident throughout his lifetime.

**Schwab- The Philip Schwab Memorial Scholarship-** The Philip Schwab Memorial Scholarship was established by Philip’s brother, Andrew in 1983. Andrew was an adjunct professor in the Communications Department and worked for a Spokane radio station at the time.

**Sittser-Diana Jane- The Diana Jane Sittser Memorial Scholarship-**This scholarship has been established in memory of Diana Jane Sittser, who died, with her mother and grandmother, in an automobile accident in 1991.

**Sittser-Lynda- Lynda F. Sittser Memorial Scholarship-** Lynda Sittser , a committed mother of four, loyal wife, and a deep and trusted friend to many, died tragically on September 27, 1991, in an automobile accident. This memorial scholarship is intended to honor her lifelong commitment to Jesus Christ, to church music, and to the cultivation of genuine faith in others, and to the renewal of the church.

**Skaggs- Charles and Maxine Skaggs Foundation Scholarship-** The Charles and Maxine Skaggs Scholarship was established on July 1, 1994 by Maxine Skaggs, the wife of a Spokane businessman who had a deep concern for people living in or coming from disadvantaged environments.

**Southminster- Southminster Presbyterian Church Scholarship-** The Southminster Presbyterian Church in Seattle, WA funds this scholarship to encourage students to attend Whitworth University.

**Stanton- Stanton Student Travel Scholarship-** The Stanton Student Travel Scholarship was established to provide funds for participation in study tours.

**STAR- STAR Sports Therapy and Rehabilitation Scholarship-** The STAR Sports Therapy and Rehabilitation Scholarship was established in 2005 by Stephen Schaefer and his associates at STAR. STAR is a regional sports-therapy and rehabilitation facility that has hired a number of graduates from the Whitworth Athletic Training Program.

**Stewart- James Stewart Family Scholarship-** Roger Crowell Stewart was a 1969 graduate of Whitworth. Upon his death, Roger’s family established this scholarship to honor their relationship with Whitworth College.

**Stien-The Howard Stien Biology & Science Study Endowment -** This scholarship was established by Dr. Mark and Gretchen Rose Wolf to provide a travel scholarship for science students to participate in science study tours. The scholarship was established as a thank you to Dr. Stien, who helped send Mark on a study tour to Costa Rica in 1992.

**Stroum- Stroum Family Foundation Business Excellence Scholarship-** Sam Stroum a prominent businessman in Seattle, Washington built upon a relationship with Whitworth alumnus Bill Curry, and became involved in the Whitworth

University Business Plus Program as a guest lecturer. The Stroum Family Foundation donated the money to establish this scholarship.

**Tangvold – David Tangvold Memorial Scholarship** –Upon the death of David Tangvold, Whitworth University received funds for an endowed scholarship in his name.

**Tavener- Tavener Music Scholarship-** The Thomas Tavener Vocal Music Scholarship was established by appreciative former students upon the retirement of their music professor Dr. Tom Tavener.

**Thomas- Rex- Rex Scott Thomas Memorial Scholarship-** Mrs. Houston Thomas established this scholarship in memory of her husband, Rex Scott Thomas. Mr. Thomas was a chemist and a graduate of the University of Southern California.

**Thompson- Lloyd G. and Norah M. Thompson Memorial Scholarship-** Reverend Dr. Lloyd Thompson Lloyd served as pastor of Lidgerwood Presbyterian Church in Spokane for a decade. His commitment to Christian education was demonstrated by his years as a member of the Board of Directors of the Whitworth Foundation. After his death, his wife, Norah, established this scholarship to honor his life, their relationship to Whitworth and their commitment to serving Christ.

**Travaille- Forrest Travaille Scholarship-** Two generations of the Travaille family chose Whitworth University and as of 1998, eight members of the Travaille family have either attended or graduated from Whitworth University. Forrest Travaille graduated from Whitworth in 1932, and spent his life in Christian service and ministry, most notably as a missionary in Thailand.

**Tyler- Lowell and Geraldine Tyler Scholarship -** Lowell Tyler was a savvy investor and he and Gerry began investing in the lives of Whitworth University students in 1985. Lowell and Gerry established several life income gifts with The Whitworth Foundation. They continued their legacy of supporting the education of youth by establishing the Lowell and Geraldine Tyler Scholarship.

**Volwiler- Volwiler Family Scholarship** – Wallace and Lynn Volwiler established this scholarship to assist generations of students who, without this aid, would not otherwise be able to attend Whitworth.

**Voorheis** – This scholarship was established in memory of Sue Voorheis. It is for any major or minor with proven interest and experience in ministry and/or church music.

**Weber- The George Weber Endowment for the School of Global Commerce and Management Department Scholarship-** This scholarship was established in honor of George Weber, a well-loved professor of accounting and business at Whitworth for over 30 years. He is particularly interested in the field of business ethics and firmly committed to the integration of faith into free market business practices.

**Wendle- Carol Wendle Endowed Scholarship in Education-**Chud Wendle and Kristin Goff established this scholarship to honor their mother, Carol Wendle, a former Whitworth College Board of Trustee who has a passion for education.

**Wilke- Beulah Wilson Wilke Scholarship-** Beulah Wilson Wilke, a woman who through her unselfish caring and generosity for others, became known as the Florence Nightingale of Davenport, Washington. She spent countless hours at hospital bedsides and ministering to the needs of widows and orphans. Upon her death, she dedicated the bulk of her estate to student scholarships.

**Wilson – Charles L. Wilson Scholarship** – Charles L. Wilson graduated from Whitworth College in 1953 with a double major in Economics and Business management. He established this scholarship with a gift through his Last Will and Testament.

**Wilson- Dale D. Wilson Scholarship-** Dale Wilson was a Davenport farmer. Upon his death in 1978, he left instructions for his estate to be partially distributed to several colleges, churches, and high schools in the Greater Spokane area.

**Winner-Christensen- The Shauna Winner/Pete Christensen Memorial Scholarship-** This scholarship was established in memory of Shauna Winner and Pete Christensen, journalism graduates of Whitworth who each died in car accidents within a year of completing their studies and beginning their careers on weekly newspapers.

**Wittwer- Myrna Wittwer Memorial Scholarship-** This scholarship was established in honor of Myrna Wittwer by her family and friends. Myrna was a loyal member of Whitworth's Computer Center staff for nearly twenty-years.

**Woodhead- Alice Bernice Woodhead Scholarship-** This scholarship was established in August, 1987 by Alice Bernice Woodhead, a 1951 graduate of Whitworth University.

**Wright- David Wright Memorial Scholarship-** David Wright served Whitworth University for twenty years, as a member of the Facilities staff. Following an accident that took Dave's life, memorial contributions and a college gift established this scholarship in his name.

**Wurster- Roland and Alice Wurster Scholarship-** Roland Wurster was a beloved Whitworth professor and staff member who worked at Whitworth College from 1957-1973. In addition to being a faculty member in the English and education departments, Roland also served in other roles, including registrar and assistant to the dean.

**Yinger – Joanna Lynn Yinger Memorial Scholarship-** The scholarship was established by Artisan Industries, Inc. along with the help and generous support of family and friends in memory of Joanna Lynn Yinger, who was the younger sister of one of Artisan's cofounders.

**Young- John and Roberta Young Degree Completion Scholarship-** Impressed with the Degree Completion program at Whitworth University, alumni John and Roberta Young established this annual scholarship to encourage adults to return to college and complete their undergraduate degrees.
