- b. Requisition for funds for a men’s retreat \$1500 - Finance committee recommended \$750 – Dustin Benac and Curtis Powell
  1. Looking to build and foster mentoring relationships
  2. Go to Camp Reed and have 24hrs with three speakers
  3. Takes the ideal and value of wisdom and uses them to engage people relationally
  4. Money will go towards food and camp costs (food is coming from Sodexo)
  5. We want to have it be as cheap as possible for those who come.
  6. Obe- Will you still charge for the event with this funding?
  7. Yes. We will charge at least a small buy-in to have guys have an investment in coming. The amount of support we receive will affect the number of people we can take.
  8. Dan Dan- What message are you trying to send to the guys who come?
  9. We want people to work on character development and understanding how to interact with God and others. We hope that guys will have the chance to really get connected.
  10. Eric- How will this benefit the whole community since it is just for men?
  11. It will obviously directly impact the men, but the desire is that the relationships with both men and women will be impacted by this.
  12. Stephen- This is for all guys around campus?
  13. Yes. This is for all guys on the whole campus.
  14. Michelle- Who are the older men you are bringing?
  15. The mentoring is intended to be between upperclassmen and lower classmen.
  16. There are six guys committed and we plan on having no more than ten in the original group because Sean Mulcahy cannot effectively lead more than ten.
  17. Kelsey – How is this different from the small groups?
  18. We are looking at more activity focused groups. The format will be less Bible study focused.

19. Joy – For those activities are the financial costs going to be on the individuals?
20. There are plenty of things that you can do that don't cost money. Otherwise they will be paying for their own costs.
21. Kendra- Your agenda for the trip is mostly speaker based?
22. The 24 hours will be packed. The three speakers will be hinged around the meals. The other time will be filled with discussion times and activities. Guys build relationships by doing things together.
23. Kelsey – After the retreat is over guys will be assigned to a mentor?
24. We want to have the mentors pursue the guys interested in being mentored.
25. Tyler – Are all the current mentors Mac guys?
26. No. Many are from off campus.
27. Kendra – If you don't secure the Lily Grant what happens to this program?
28. The reality is that it would be hard but we would be creative in fund-raising.
29. John D – If you don't get this money does it have to happen on November 15<sup>th</sup>?
30. We would probably push it back to next semester. Now is the timing that would be ideal.
31. Kendra- Your balance does not add up.
32. We aren't certain about money from Lily or ASWU. We asked for slightly more assuming we won't get all the money from both sources.

ii. Discussion

1. John – I feel as though this is what the SGCs do.
2. Jeremiah – I feel that this will reach out to people not just in a spiritual way.
3. Seth- We planned on giving based on a per capita basis. We wanted to give \$7.50 per person. We looked at what precedence we will be setting. We feel that this does fit with our mission. We looked also at the involvement from faculty.
4. Dan Dan – I agree with the purpose of the program, but how much do we feel the post retreat effects will actually work?
5. Jeremiah – They talked about what they will do afterwards for follow up. They already have six guys set up.
6. Aaron – The goal is to have a group of more older guys than just the original ten or six guys. They want to have a more peer to peer mentorship.
7. Kyle – If we approve this as ASWU will we be sponsoring something that may compete with the small group program.
8. Katie – We are looking at if this is a financially acceptable output of our funds. I feel that it is a decent event, I don't think that our decisions should be based on if we feel this program will have a lasting effect on campus.
9. Kendra – We will give \$7.50 a piece up to \$750.
10. Eric – Everything that we support ends up competing with something else.
