  - a. Club updates
    - i. Ryan – ACM
      - 1. We have about fifty active members
      - 2. We will have a video game night before finals
      - 3. We are headed to Laser Quest next week
    - ii. Jennifer – Four Directions Native American Club
      - 1. On Saturday we are heading to Idaho for a Powwow
      - 2. Monday of Cultural Awareness Week we are having Indian tacos and fry bread
      - 3. Tuesday we will be selling beaded items and we will be making beaded turtles during primetime in Duvall
    - iii. Blair – Spandex Optional
      - 1. We plan bike rides on the weekend with various skill levels
      - 2. We have had four rides this fall with between 5 and 15 participants
      - 3. We don't have a ton of activities during the winter but we plan on continuing with rides in the spring
      - 4. Public service announcement for storing bikes in the fall
      - 5. We will be changing leadership in the spring
  - b. The Mancation requisition

- i. The Mancation event has about 68 guys signed up. They would still like to have all \$750 that we had originally set aside for them assuming they have 100 students attend.
  - ii. Discussion:
    - 1. Obe- I see giving them all the money as more of becoming like a charity case. Everyone would like extra money to cover their extra expenses. We are not responsible for their planning.
    - 2. Dan Dan- Can't we wait to see if they do go over budget?
    - 3. Aaron – They have asked for about \$5 more per person. Maybe we can compromise and change from \$7.50 to \$9.50 per person.
    - 4. Katie – According to the financial standard operating procedures an
    - 5. Michelle – We told them how much they were planning on two weeks ago and I feel that they should have planned accordingly.
    - 6. Eric – They did not receive as much as they planned on from the Lily Grant
    - 7. Joy – I agree with Michelle and Obe that we should not set a dangerous precedent in changing our requisitions.
    - 8. Eric – We do have the money and it was set aside for it.
  - iii. Continued discussion
    - 1. Emily – I don't understand why it is so hard for us to give them the \$750 that we had originally offered them.
    - 2. Kendra – The reason this was based on the number of students going is to affect a larger number of students for so much money.
    - 3. Aaron- I think we agree that they don't want to set a bad precedent, so how about we split the difference of between \$750 of what they do not make.
