# **Emergency Response at Whitworth University**

What You Need to Know

### Q: What is an incident that constitutes an emergency?

A: An occurrence or event, natural or human-caused, which requires a response to protect life or property.

### Q: How will campus respond to an emergency?

A: We have an <u>emergency response plan</u> based on the National Incident Command System; it is posted on the Whitworth website.

# Q: How will I be notified in an emergency?

A: Voice notification will be broadcast through the **blue light stations** (outside), electronic **message boards** and phones (inside) and via WhitALERT **text message**.

## Q: What should I know before an emergency?

- 1) Know the quickest escape route out of a building.
- 2) Know the emergency equipment in the building where you live, learn, play or work (fire extinguishers, fire pull handles, etc.).
- 3) Watch the Whitworth University Emergency Response video.
- 4) In the event of an active shooter: Run, Hide, Fight. If you cannot run and have to lock-down know the best place to hide, preferably behind a locked door.
- 5) Review "Campus Emergency Instructions" posters located in every classroom and building throughout campus.

## Q: What is my role in an emergency?

A: Take these actions:



- 1) Take action to ensure your own personal life safety.
- 2) Call 911.
- 3) Call Security at **509-777-4444**. *Program this into your phone.*
- 4) Follow first responder instructions, and directions from WhitALERT, blue light or electronic message board broadcasts.
