Consult the Whitworth University course catalog for the most up-to-date graduation requirements. GSE-Certification Office to mark an X next to all the items that apply when completed:

- Complete at least 60 credits for the M.Ed. School Counseling Program and must have a 3.00 grade point average to graduate. The lowest grade acceptable for a degree credit is a "C-." Some counseling classes require a "B" grade to pass.
- Complete core courses, EDC 501, EDC 504, EDC 511, and EDC 512 with a "B" or better. EDC 501 – Introduction to Professional School Counseling requires a "B" to proceed with the program.
- Complete pre-residency and fingerprint clearance along with insurance coverage prior to practicum.
- Complete a statistics course prior to taking EDU 515 Educational Research if not waived at admission.
- Complete/pass EDC 597 Master's Comprehensive Exam (CPCE) by February of year graduating.
- Complete/pass written comprehensive exam to be complete during EDC 584.
- Complete/pass interview with School Counseling PEAB in October preceding practicum.
- Complete EDC 581 School Counseling Practicum with a minimum of 100 hours.
- Complete EDC 583 Internship I and EDC 584 Internship II with a minimum of 600 total hours.
- Complete/pass PEAB Review Board Exit Interview at end of program.
- Apply for graduation through Self-Service portal.
